Having just returned to the Gold Coast last week from climbing Pyramids (Egypt) and Glaciers (Norway) it is time to re-join reality at Southport. We complain about rising costs, but the UK is expensive – lamb is about \$55 per kg and a cup of coffee about \$8.

I managed to get a few things done during my holidays. Firstly, I submitted an application for a small grant for Seniors Month and spoke with the Centre Managers at Australia Fair. We may have some support to put on a few demonstration classes outside Coles.

I also met up with Regional Development Australia (RDA) for the Gold Coast to see if they have anything of interest we could support and also for any grants. Unfortunately, the grants are too large (\$500K plus) and need to be matched. I am currently speaking with AusIndustry to obtain a list of smaller grants. An application for a grant has been submitted for repair of the Margaret Street Hall roof through the Council. The outcome will be known soon.

With the new semester starting we are excited about a few extra courses. A key one is on Wine Appreciation, and we are hoping this will be ready to proceed in August, starting with Sparkling Wines. A small fee will need to be charged to

cover the cost of the wine. We are hoping for a few subsidies to minimise the extra costs.
