Achievements in past 12 months:

- ✓ Increased classes from 55 to 70.
- ✓ Increased membership from 350 to 560.
- ✓ Fundraising that created the first surplus bank balance.
- ✓ Increased exposure by attending events and promoting U3A Southport at Seniors Health & Lifestyle Expo and Botanical Bazaar.
- ✓ Collaboration with Retail First to promote Seniors' Month in Australia Fair with interactive displays by U3A classes.
- ✓ Obtained large retail space in more prominent area of Australia Fair for U3A art exhibition, sales and promotion.
- ✓ Promotional talks at Men's Sheds, Probus and other organisations.

It has been a massive 12 months since the last AGM. Part of our Strategic Plan was to double our membership within three years – well, we are almost there in just over 12 months. Another was to increase the number of classes on offer – the number is rising on a weekly basis and we now have the largest and greatest variety of classes ever.

Some things we don't have control over are our continued lease agreement with the GCCC for Australia Fair premises and the on-going state of disrepair at Margaret Street. We currently hire 19 rooms per week at the Community Centre and this will increase to 21 in Semester 2. Although we now have the funds, thanks to a surplus last financial year, for hiring more space at the Community Centre, availability of suitable rooms on an ongoing basis presents a problem.

Our sub-lease at Australia Fair is the subject of discussion with the Gold Coast City Council and Australia Fair Management and is currently on a month-to-month basis. The Management Committee's discussion with Australia Fair Management has been fairly positive and we believe we should be secure for at least the next 12 months.

The lease on our Margaret St Hall will likely not be renewed in 2027 as there is a lot of work that needs to be done to the building.

Be assured we are working very hard with Australia Fair Management and the Council to secure a suitable future location in the Southport area which fulfils our needs and is close to public transport.

Membership Fee Increase for 2025

A very minimal increase of \$5.00 per annum for 2025 was agreed at the AGM.

KEEPING YOUR VALUABLES SAFE

While the best place to store your valuables within your home is in a safe, this isn't an option for everyone. Here are some suggestions where your valuables probably won't be discovered. Remember, the main thing you're looking to do here is store things in places where a thief wouldn't automatically look, so feel free to get creative and stray from this list.



In your pot plants

If your home is full of potted plants, the space between the pot and the decorative container can be a great place to store valuables (in a waterproof container of course). Just remember where you've put them.

In the pantry

Almost any food container that you can't easily see into provides a potential hiding spot for valuables like an empty biscuit box, baking powder tin, cereal box, etc (stashed with valuables) placed at the back of your pantry.





In the laundry

Your laundry isn't going to provide much value to thieves, so they'll tend to focus their attention elsewhere. This means that you should be pretty safe to make *use of an old washing powder box*. For extra security, you can bury them underneath the laundry powder, in a bag of course, to keep the powder off them.

In the garage box pile

Most of us have a pile of boxes in our garage that are full of things we hardly ever touch. This means that thieves probably won't touch this pile either, giving you a golden opportunity to hide larger valuables.



In paint cans



You can also consider using a paint can that's been cleaned out to hide things. This one is generally a lot more effective if you've got multiple pots in your cupboard or garage.

Inside a book

Books can be pretty good hiding places for small valuables like your passport. If you're the type who has endless books in your home, no thief is going to rummage through them. This means that you can safely hollow out the centre of one (or simply purchase a ready-made one) and hide small items within the pages.




Remember where you have put things and tell at least one trustworthy family member.

Although these hiding places are good in a pinch, the best way to protect your belongings against would-be thieves is to make your home as unappealing as possible. This means having good locks on all doors and windows, installing a security camera system, and ensuring that your home looks occupied, even when it isn't.


