

QUEENSLAND SPECTACLE SUPPLY SCHEME

The Queensland Spectacle Supply Scheme (SSS) provides eligible residents with a pair of basic prescription spectacles every two years. To be eligible, you must hold a valid Australian Government concession card, such as a Pensioner Concession, Health Care, Seniors, or Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) card. The scheme is intended to provide cost-of-living relief and encourage people to get their eyes checked.

- > Eligibility: You must be a Queensland resident holding a qualifying concession card.
- > Benefit: You are entitled to one pair of basic prescription spectacles once every two years.
- Cost: The scheme covers the cost of basic prescription glasses, though this may not cover advanced options.
- ➤ How to access: Visit an optometrist who participates in the scheme and present your concession card. Below are some optometrists in the local area (a full list is available on the Queensland Health website address below).

- State government initiative: This is a Queensland government initiative to help with eye health and cost of living pressures.
